Imagine you are a Dungeon show developer.

- Your task is to research aspects of history to find the next gruesome tale for a new Dungeon experience.
- Once you have found a horrendous historical event to focus on, create a story board for your new show.

Other Dungeons around the UK have covered time periods going as far back as the 12th Century to the 17th Century.

Your task is to find information on either of the following centuries:

- 18th Century Georgian Era
- 19th Century Victorian Era



When you have gathered enough research, choose a horrendous historical event to focus on. Use this as the inspiration for your show, of course you can embellish and dramatize, make sure its suitable for the Dungeons.

Think about:

- Your target audience remember your show should make people laugh and scream.
- The setting the look and feel of it, don't forget to include sound and lighting for effect.
- The plot a clear problem and solution, including plenty of laughs and scares.
- The characters up to four memorable characters with vast personality differences.
- The script appropriate for your target audience
- The props must be from the appropriate time and as gory as possible!









Here are some clues for events from the 19th Century...
